- prescription
- non-prescription (over the counter)
- controlled substances
- veterinary medications

## Unacceptable

- no sharps or lancets
- no medical waste
- no illicit drugs or marijuana products
- no aerosols or hydrogen peroxide

**Empty pills from bottles into plastic bag & seal. Keep liquids in original bottle.**
