TEEN WELLNESS & PREVENTION COMMUNITY REPORT 2023



CALY's efforts throughout the year focus on mobilizing community involvement in planning and implementing strategies and activities to prevent youth substance use. We track our efforts and gather and analyze data to monitor progress and share with the community. These are building blocks for effective prevention efforts. Earlier this year we engaged our coalition to develop a sustainability plan to ensure prevention efforts continue when our DFC funding ends in 2026. This report includes highlights of our collective efforts during this past year.

BUILDING CAPACITY FOR PREVENTION

10-YEAR YOUTH MASTER PLAN

Western Placer Unified School District (WPUSD) and the City of Lincoln are investing big to develop a **10-Year Youth Master Plan** for the City of Lincoln. With the goal of increasing positive connections, supports, and opportunities for youth in Lincoln, we joined WPUSD and the City of Lincoln, as well as youth, parents, youth serving organizations, law enforcement and other community agencies to provide input in the development of the Lincoln Youth Master Plan.

With a strengths-based approach, the Youth Development Network facilitated training, conducted listening sessions with students and parents, and **surveyed over 2,000 middle and high school students** from diverse backgrounds. This assessment process examines positive and caring relationships, caring adults, and opportunities for meaningful participation. We learn from youth, parents, educators and the community where Lincoln is doing well so we can build on

these strengths as well as identify gaps and opportunities to improve school and community climate.







1 PILL CAN KILL PLACER CAMPAIGN

CALY and partners educated and informed students, parents and the community, including local and state legislators about the dangers fentanyl poses to youth. Led by the Placer County District Attorney's Office, our 1 Pill Can Kill Placer Campaign team including Placer County HHS, local bereaved parents, CALY and Granite Wellness Centers presented 54 assemblies at 17 High Schools and 10 Middle Schools reaching over 30,000 students. We also hosted **12 parent information nights**. The campaign elevates the message to teens, young adults and parents that prescription pills are not safe unless they are obtained directly from the doctor or pharmacy. We set out to ensure every community member is aware that fentanyl is flooding our area and dealers are targeting young people through social media.

Additionally, as a result of educating and informing the community, California's Governor signed new legislation that every public school parent will have an opportunity to learn of the risks.



FREE YOUR MIND, FREE THE AIR 5K AWARENESS RUN

The Placer County Youth Commission hosted the 3rd Annual Free Your Mind, Free The Air 5K Awareness Run to reduce nicotine use and increase mental health awareness. Youth Commissioners organized and coordinated the event inviting CALY and other community partners and agencies to volunteer and participate. The Free Your Mind, Free the Air theme promotes the importance of a healthy body and a healthy mind. We increased awareness about how nicotine is addictive and hijacks the brain chemistry increasing mental health and addiction issues. Information was also shared about strategies tobacco companies use that disproportionally target certain minority groups, creating a disparity in those who are affected by tobacco ailments.
